

APEDA Certificate Fees: What Exporters Should Know

It is important to understand that an APEDA certificate is different from an Import Export Code (IEC), GST registration, or other product-specific approvals. Depending on the nature of the business, exporters may need several registrations before beginning international trade.

What Is an APEDA Certificate?

APEDA registration is an important compliance requirement for eligible exporters dealing with products covered under the APEDA Act and applicable scheduled products.

APEDA works under the Ministry of Commerce and Industry and supports the development and promotion of exports of agricultural and processed food products.

Eligible exporters may register with APEDA and obtain the applicable registration certificate, commonly referred to as an RCMC or APEDA registration certificate.

The registration provides a formal connection between the exporter and APEDA and can support participation in applicable export promotion activities.

What Are APEDA Certificate Fees?

APEDA certificate fees refer primarily to the government charges applicable for APEDA registration or the relevant certificate. The applicable amount should always be checked against the latest official APEDA fee structure because government charges and procedures can change.

Apart from the official fee, an applicant may also incur other expenses depending on their circumstances, such as:

- Documentation charges
- Professional consultancy fees
- Certification expenses
- Testing charges, where applicable
- Product-specific compliance costs
- Other regulatory expenses

Therefore, exporters should distinguish between the official APEDA fee and the overall cost of completing their export compliance requirements.

Who Needs APEDA Registration?

Businesses exporting agricultural and processed food products covered under APEDA's jurisdiction may need the applicable registration.

Eligible applicants can include:

- Merchant exporters
- Manufacturer-exporters
- Processors
- Agricultural product exporters
- Food processing businesses
- Farmer producer organizations
- Other eligible exporters

The exact applicability depends on the product category and business activity.

APEDA License and APEDA Registration

The term [APEDA license](#) is commonly used by businesses when referring to APEDA registration or export-related approval. Technically, exporters should identify the specific registration or certificate applicable to their products rather than assuming that every exporter requires the same type of license.

An APEDA registration may be relevant for exporters dealing in scheduled agricultural and processed food products. Other products may fall under different export promotion councils or regulatory authorities.

Is an APEDA Export License Required?

Valid IEC

An [Import Export Code](#) issued by DGFT is an important requirement for businesses undertaking exports from India.

Eligible Products

The business should deal in products falling within the applicable APEDA scheduled product categories.

Updated Business Information

PAN, GST, address, bank, and authorized signatory details should be accurate and updated.

Documents Required for APEDA Registration

The exact documentation may vary according to the applicant and business structure.

Common documents can include:

- PAN card
- Import Export Code
- GST registration certificate
- Business registration documents
- Certificate of incorporation, where applicable
- Partnership deed or LLP agreement, where applicable
- Bank account details
- Address proof
- Details of authorized signatory
- Product information
- Other documents required by APEDA

Applicants should ensure that the information provided in the application matches their existing government records.

APEDA Farm Registration

Businesses involved in agricultural exports may also come across the term [APEDA farm registration](#). Farm-related registration, traceability, certification, or documentation requirements can apply depending on the agricultural commodity and export destination.

Farmers, exporters, aggregators, and other stakeholders should determine whether their particular product requires farm-level registration or traceability under the applicable export program.

APEDA farm-related requirements can be different from standard exporter registration. Therefore, businesses should not assume that an exporter registration automatically satisfies every farm-level or product-specific requirement.

How to Apply for APEDA Registration Online?

The application process can generally be completed through the applicable APEDA online system.

Step 1: Obtain IEC

Ensure that the business has a valid Import Export Code before beginning the APEDA registration process.

Step 2: Check Product Eligibility

Confirm that the products intended for export fall under the applicable APEDA category.

Step 3: Prepare Documents

Keep PAN, IEC, GST, bank details, business documents, and other supporting information ready.

Step 4: Register on the APEDA Portal

Create an account or access the applicable registration service through the APEDA online platform.

Step 5: Complete the Application

Enter accurate details about the exporter, business, products, address, and authorized representative.

Step 6: Upload Documents

Submit the required documents in the prescribed format.

Step 7: Pay the Applicable Fee

Pay the prescribed APEDA registration fee through the available online payment facility.

Step 8: Submit the Application

Review all details carefully before submitting the application and save the acknowledgement or reference number.

Step 9: Verification

The application and supporting documents may be reviewed by the concerned authority. Additional clarification may be requested where required.

Step 10: Receive the Certificate

After successful processing, the applicable APEDA registration certificate or [RCMC Registration](#) can be issued according to the relevant procedure.

Although the government registration fee may be straightforward, the overall cost of export compliance can vary.

Additional expenses may arise from:

- Product testing
- Laboratory reports
- Packaging compliance
- Certification requirements
