How to Clean a Leather Jacket at Home:

For general leather jacket cleaning, follow these simple steps.

Gather Your Cleaning Supplies:

You will need:

- A soft microfibre cloth
- Mild soap or leather cleaner
- Lukewarm water
- A dry towel
- Leather conditioner

Step 1 - Remove Surface Dust and Dirt:

Use a dry microfiber cloth to gently wipe the entire jacket. Pay special attention to cuffs, collars and pockets where dirt tends to accumulate.

Step 2 - Prepare a Gentle Cleaning Solution:

Mix a small amount of mild soap with lukewarm water. Avoid harsh detergents, bleach, ammonia-based products, or household cleaners, as these can damage the leather.

Step 3 - Wipe the Leather Carefully:

Dip the cloth into the solution and wring it out thoroughly. The cloth should be damp, not wet. Gently wipe the jacket using circular motions. Avoid soaking the leather, as excessive moisture can cause warping or discolouration.

Step 4 - Remove Soap Residue:

Using a clean damp cloth, wipe away any remaining soap residue from the surface.

Step 5 - Dry Naturally:

Pat the jacket with a clean towel and allow it to air dry naturally at room temperature.

Never place a leather jacket near radiators, heaters, [tumble dryers](#), or direct sunlight, as rapid drying can lead to cracking.

Oil and Grease Stains:

What to Do:

Sprinkle cornflour or talcum powder onto the stain and leave it overnight. The powder helps absorb excess oil from the leather.

The next day, gently brush away the residue using a soft cloth.

Ink Stains:

Ink can penetrate leather quickly. Dab the stain gently with a cotton bud lightly moistened with rubbing alcohol. Avoid scrubbing, as this may spread the stain further.

Water Marks:

Prevent Permanent Spots:

If water spots appear, lightly dampen the surrounding area and allow the leather to dry evenly. This helps prevent visible water rings from forming.
